Expanding Its Heavy Lift Division in Alaska

Pacific Pile & Marine recently expanded its heavy lift division in Cook Inlet, increasing its role as a heavy civil and marine solutions provider in Alaska. The firm enhanced its already-robust fleet of marine equipment with the D.B. Salvation, a 300x90x20 flat deck service barge equipped with a 4600 Series 4 Crane.

The D.B. Salvation/4600 S4 expansion gives clients access to a lifting capacity of 600 tons off the stern and 350 tons over the side, as well as a four-drum winch system, 110-ton support crane and 500-square-foot operations center.

"This new equipment allows us to more readily meet the industry's needs," Project Manager Jordan Clark said. "We plan to continue to grow our heavy lift division to assist with more of the exploration jobs in Cook Inlet and to service the oil industry."

Pacific Pile & Marine offers a range of construction services, including design-build. "Clients are always impressed to learn the extent of our capabilities; from environmental dredging to marine construction, to piers and jetties, to pile driving and foundations—you name it we've done it," says Clark.
